

## Parental Involvement Act 2006

In May 2006 the Scottish Parliament passed the Parental Involvement (Scotland) Act which aims to help parents to be:

- involved with their child's education and learning
- welcomed as an active participant in the life of the school
- encouraged to express their views on school education.

The Act was introduced to help parents, carers and schools work together as partners in children's learning. It places duties on schools, local authorities and Scottish

Government to make it easier for parents to become involved

Getting it right for every child and young person is a national policy to help all children and young people grow, develop and reach their full potential. Its focus is to improve outcomes for children and their families based on a shared understanding of their well being.
